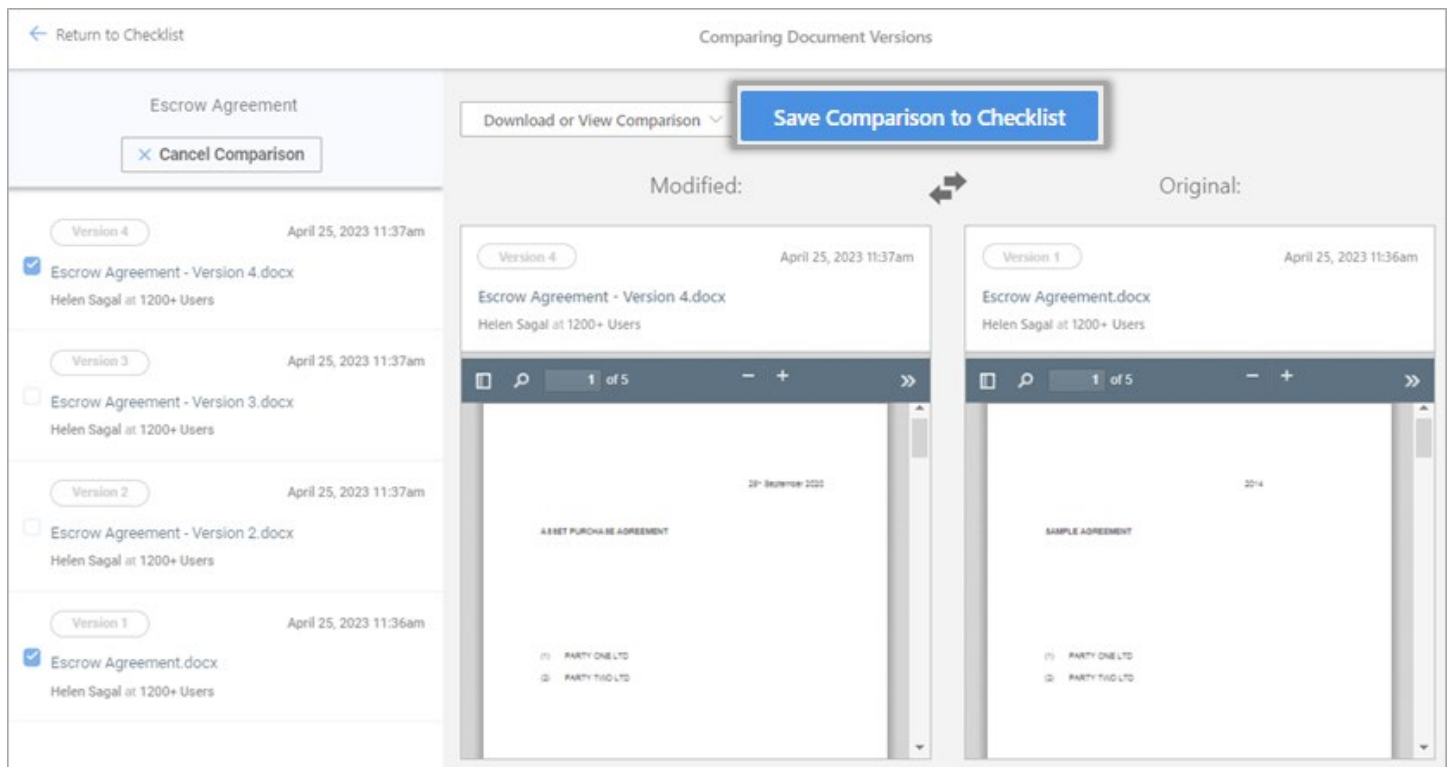


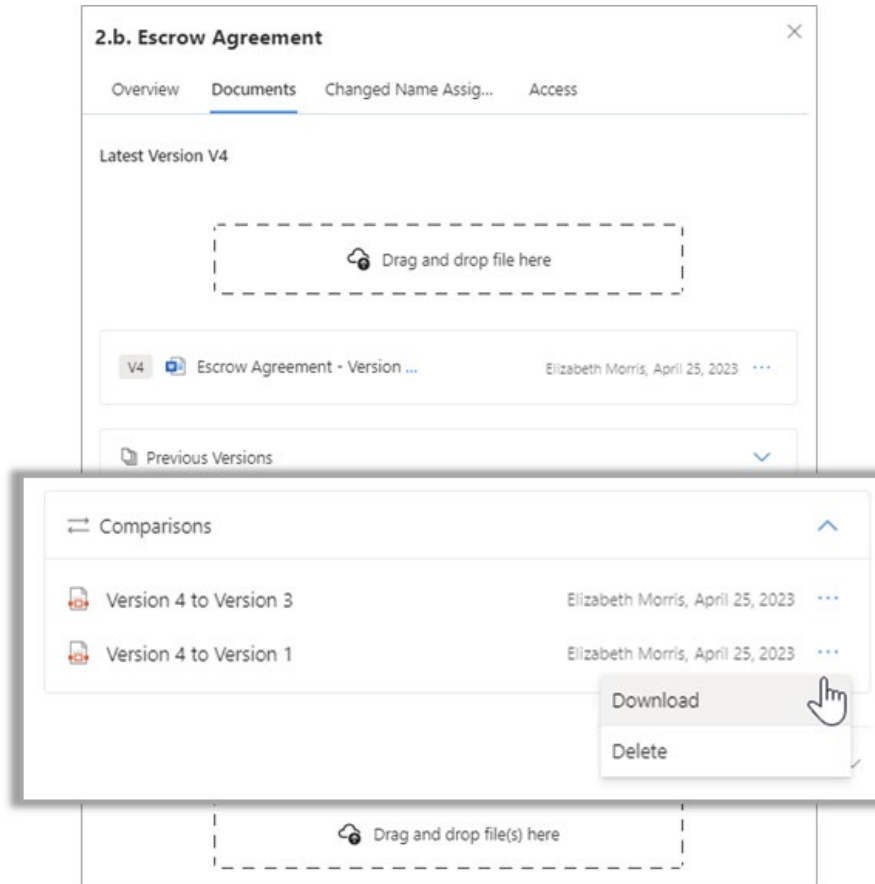

### Save comparisons to the checklist

When you're in the middle of your deal, it's essential to run comparisons between versions of your primary documents to keep your transaction moving forward. For easier usability and accessibility of these comparisons, we've introduced functionality to save comparisons directly to the checklist.



Users can select any two versions of a checklist document to compare and click **Save Comparison to Checklist**. The comparison is generated and automatically saved to the checklist as a PDF.

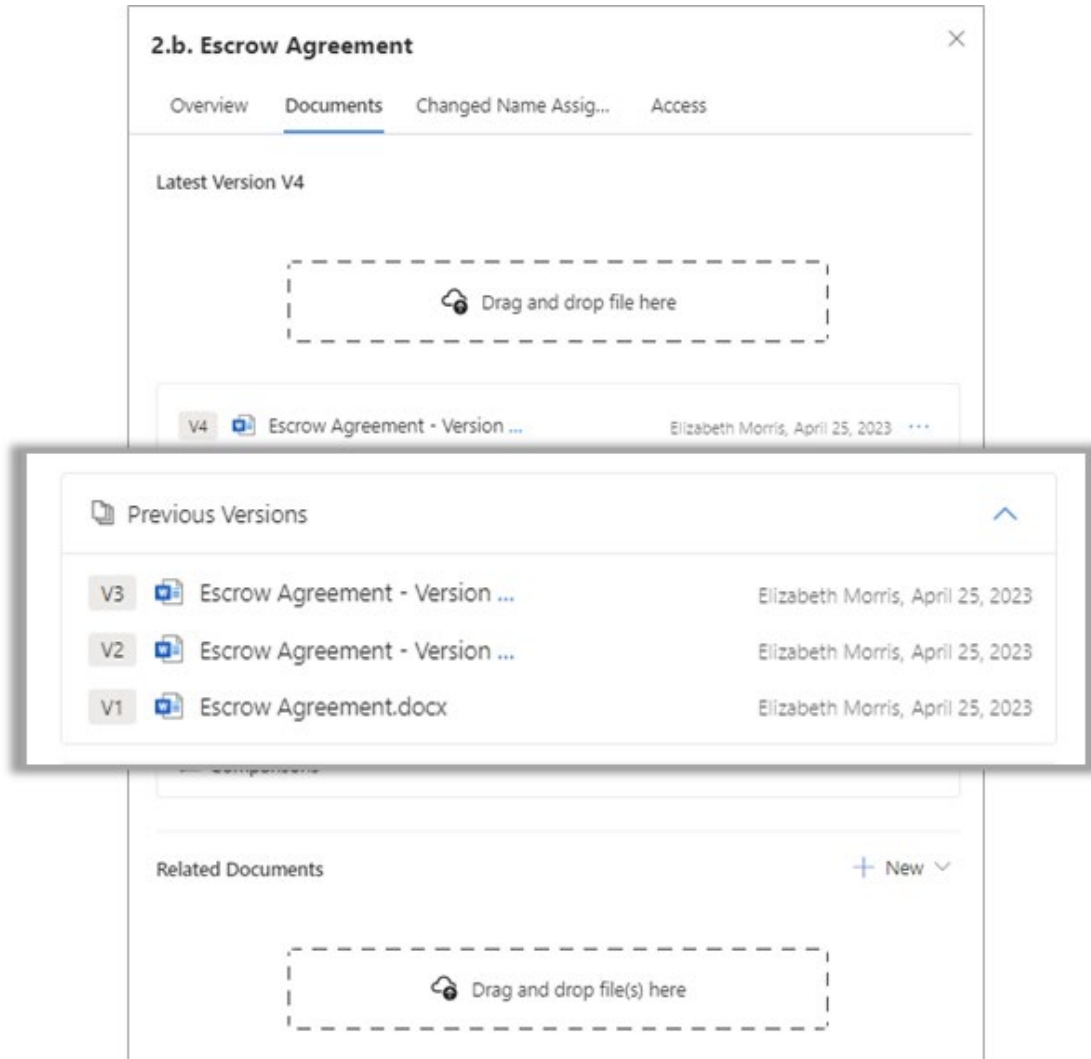


Within the **Documents** tab for a checklist item, users can see all comparisons saved for that item. They can view a comparison by clicking on it, download the comparison, and delete the comparison.

**Note:** Owinging firm users can delete all comparisons; external users can only delete the comparisons they generated.

## Access all versions from the checklist

To make it easier to access and view previous versions of a document, we've added a **Previous Versions** section to the **Documents** tab for a checklist item.

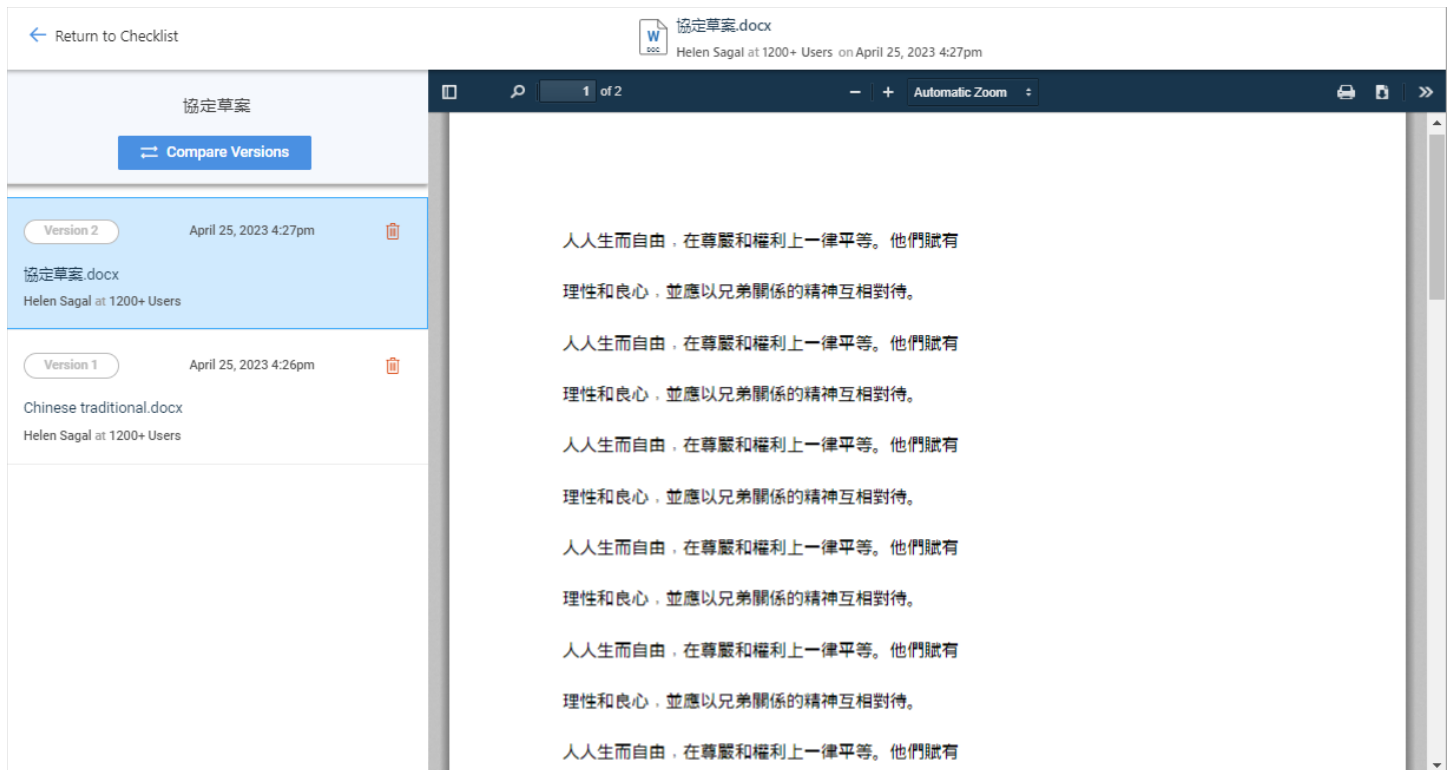


Users can see all versions within the checklist and view any version by clicking on it.

## Support for Chinese and Japanese alphabets

To provide a better experience for firms and clients working with documents using non-Latin alphabets, Litera Transact now supports Chinese and Japanese alphabets (simplified Chinese, traditional Chinese, hiragana, katakana, and kanji).

Previously, characters from these alphabets were converted to square boxes. With this release, Chinese and Japanese names and content in all areas of Litera Transact are displayed and converted clearly.

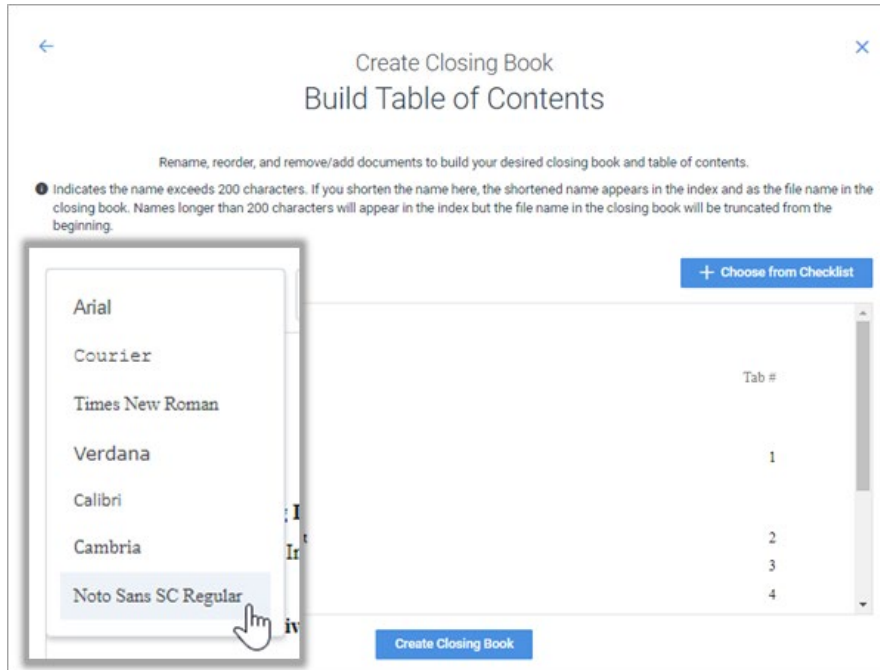


**Note:** Files using Chinese and Japanese alphabets uploaded before the 4.19 release, will still show square boxes when previewed, and in closing books.

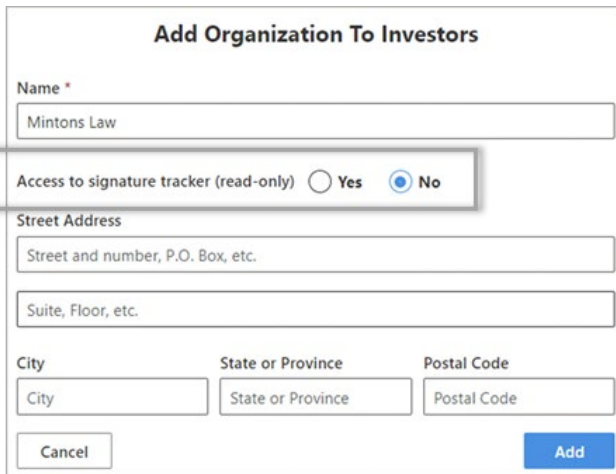
When creating closing books that include documents using the Chinese or Japanese alphabets (simplified Chinese, traditional Chinese, hiragana, katakana, and kanji), users must select **Noto Sans SC Regular** as the font for the index to ensure characters display correctly.



The **Noto Sans SC Regular** font also supports Latin alphabets.

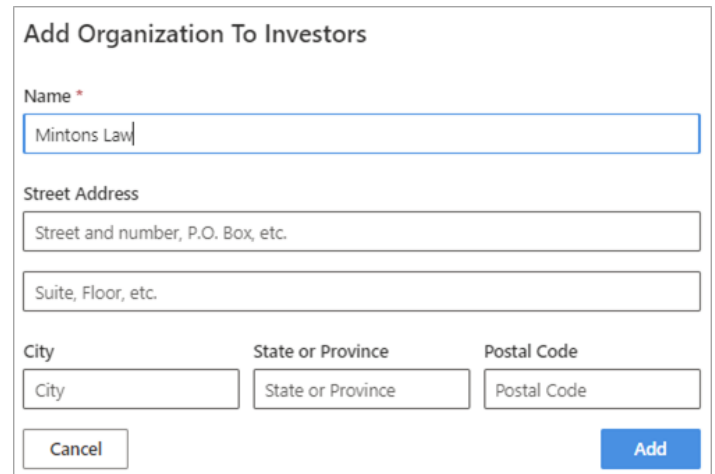
### Removed org-based signature tracker access

To eliminate confusion about external organizations’ access to signature trackers, we’ve removed the old method of establishing access at the time an organization is added to the platform. Now, an external collaborator’s access to a signature tracker is determined solely by the permissions set for that collaborator’s role, in the working group list. When adding organizations from the working group list or **People** page (admins only), there is no longer the option to give access to the signature tracker.

**Note:** External collaborators who currently have access to signature trackers at the organization level may lose access if they don’t have it enabled in their permissions at the deal level.

### Issues Fixed

- When the permissions set for the external collaborator’s role prevent access to items, the external collaborator will not receive any updates for those items in email notifications, even if the external collaborator has been given access to an item in the **Access** tab.
- In organizations with hundreds of deals and users, Litera Transact was slow when searching for deals on the Deals page and users on the People page. This issue has been fixed and the performance improved so that the platform displays search results more quickly.
- Users were able to change the signature page template after a page was sent for signing, causing issues in displaying the page in the Pages tab. This issue has been fixed and users cannot change a template for a signature page that has already been sent for signing. Users will see a message advising them to first void the signature packet if they want to change the template.
- Various performance and stability improvements.
